

Additional Klondike Details

Gear Inspection:

Review of sled, Patrol gear and personal gear of each Patrol member. Will require adequate communication prior to Klondike to ensure that all persons are aware of the needs of winter camping.

Sled: 100 pts

May not be purchased, but may include purchased parts (i.e. used skis for runners). Must be at minimum 4 feet long, 1.5 feet wide and 3.5 feet high at push bar. No wheels may be attached. Any material may be used. Must be able to transport (carry) one average size adult.

Required Patrol Equipment: 120 pts

Fire starter	50' of 300 lb test rope
Matches	Tarp (6'x6' min)
Compass	Shovel
Map of area	Limb saw
Water (1 liter)	Sleeping bag
Patrol cook kit*	First Aid kit

*This should be a simple, backcountry set-up of one or two pots, a mixing/serving spoon and a backpacking stove. If you are using a canister stove, be sure to bring a low temp fuel such as Iso-Pro mix.

This is a list of the minimum Patrol equipment. Additional items such as insulated footpads, skis, snowshoes, staves or poles, etc. may be carried as long as they do not impede the Patrol's ability to carry one average sized Scout.

Personal Scout Equipment:

Clothing : 100 pts	Equipment: 100 pts
Wicking base layer	Polarizing sun glasses
Warmth providing mid layer	1 liter of water
Wind/wet blocking outer layer	Matches
Liner gloves	Personal first aid kit
Mittens/gauntlets	Compass
Hat	Map of area
Neck gaiter or scarf	Knife
Wicking socks	Sunscreen
Warm outer socks	Trail food
Waterproof boots or Mukluks	Full set of dry clothing

Additional points may be awarded for well thought out additional gear, sled design, Scout Spirit, etc., provided that total points do not exceed 500.

Depending on the actual weather, Scouts may not wear all of the clothing above. Regardless, the clothing should be in evidence in the Scout's pack. This same is true for the required equipment. The point is to teach winter camping skills and such clothing and equipment is a necessary part of winter camping. Points should be deducted from the Patrol accordingly. Pointing is at the discretion of the Sight Captain and may only be appealed by the Senior Patrol Leader to the Event Senior Patrol Leader. If the Senior Patrol Leader is not a part of the Patrol under inspection, the Patrol Leader may appeal to the Senior Patrol Leader for the event. The decision of the Event Senior Patrol Leader is final.
